

Pop-up, Lift the Flap, and Other Interactive Books

The following list is a sample of fun, interactive books to share with your child. Titles are shelved in the picture book section by the first three letters of the author's last name unless otherwise noted. For more titles, search "toy and movable books" on the MORE online catalog. Need help? Ask a librarian!

Blechman, Nicholas. **Night Light**. (E BLE)

Count the lights and, through die-cut pages, find out which vehicle they belong to.

Carle, Eric. **The Very Busy Spider**. (E CAR)

The farm animals try to divert a busy little spider from spinning her web, but she persists and produces a thing of both beauty and usefulness. The pictures may be felt as well as seen.

Cousins, Lucy. **Count with Maisy, Cheep, Cheep, Cheep!** (E COU)

In an interactive farmyard game of hide-and-seek, intrepid little mouse Maisy searches beneath lift-flaps to locate Mommy Hen's missing chicks.

Cousins, Lucy. **Maisy's World of Animals**. (E COU)

Maisy discovers a world of animals in this lift-the-flap book.

Faulkner, Keith. **The Wide-mouthed Frog: A Pop-up Book**. (E FAU)

A wide-mouthed frog is interested in what other animals eat--until he meets a creature that eats only wide-mouthed frogs!

Ferri, Giuliano. **Peekaboo**. (E GIU)

Animals play peekaboo in a book that encourages young readers to lift the animals' paws, wings, and hooves to reveal their faces.

Fox, Mem. **Yoo-hoo Ladybug!** (E FOX)

Invites the reader to search for Ladybug, who loves to hide.

Gibbs, Edward. **I Spy Pets**. (E GIB)

Invites young readers to guess which animal will be revealed using the given clues and a spy hole.

Hall, Michael. **It's an Orange Aardvark!** (E HAL)

A carpenter ant drills a hole to see what is outside his stump, worrying his fellow ants, and when new holes reveal different colors they fabricate a story about the horrible beast that will soon attack.

Handford, Martin. **Where's Waldo Now?** (E HAN)

The reader follows Waldo as he travels through different time periods in history and must try to find him in the illustrations of some of the crowded events in which he participates.

Horáček, Petr. **Honk, Honk! Baa, Baa!** (Board Books: BB HOR)

Readers are invited to turn the pages to identify the different sounds animals make.

Idle, Molly. **Flora and the Penguin**. (E FLO)

In this wordless, lift-the-flap picture book, Flora and her new friend, the penguin, dance on the ice together and learn to treat each other with respect and kindness.

Kainen, Dan. **Ocean: a Photicular Book**. (Juvenile Non-fiction: 551.46 KAI)

Via a process that uses lenticular technology, sliding lenses, and original four-color video imagery, provides an introduction to various marine animals whose images appear to move.

- Kaufmann, Carol; created by Dan Kainen. **Safari: A Photicular Book.** (Juvenile Non-fiction: J 599.096 KAI)
Using an innovative lenticular-based technology, precision sliding lenses, and original four-color video imagery, each image is like a 3-D movie on the page, delivering a rich and fluid visual experience.
- Klausmeier, Jesse. **Open This Little Book.** (E KLA)
Pages of decreasing, then increasing, size open to reveal different animals, each opening a book of a different color and reading about the next.
- Low, William. **Machines Go to Work in the City.** (E LOW)
This book provides illustrations and fold-out pictures of machines that are used in a city.
- Marzollo, Jean. **I Spy A to Z: A Book of Picture Riddles.** (E WIC)
Easy-to-read riddles by Jean Marzollo are paired with 46 object-filled photographs by Walter Wick to create the most engaging alphabet book ever!
- Matheson, Christie. **Tap the Magic Tree.** (E MAT)
Invites the reader to tap, rub, touch, and wiggle illustrations to make an apple tree bloom, produce fruit, and lose its leaves.
- Matheson, Christie. **Touch the Brightest Star.** (E MAT)
An interactive picture book showcasing the beauty of nighttime.
- Merlin. **Under the Hood.** (E MER)
A mechanic welcomes the reader to his garage where he will try to fix his car, but first needs help in finding his friends, Mouse, Crocodile, and Bird under lift-up flaps and fold-out pages.
- Murphy, Mary. **Say Hello Like This!** (E MUR)
This lively split-page-format book shows how animals say hello with different sounds.
- Rubin, Adam. **Robo-Sauce.** (E RUB)
A special sauce turns a boy into a robot, and he then transforms everyone and everything into robots, including the book.
- Steer, Dugald. **Pirateology.** (Juvenile Non-fiction: J 910.45 STE)
Aar! Hoist the sails for a lavish new discovery filled with treasures.
- Tullet, Hervé. **Let's Play!** (E TUL)
A lively yellow dot leads the reader through a journey through color, shape, and a child's imagination.
- Tupera Tupera. **Polar Bear's Underwear.** (E TUP)
Polar Bear has lost his underwear and he asks his friend, Mouse, to help him find it.
