Spotlight Article: Public Computers

The Amery Area Public Library provides access to the Internet and to electronic resources as part of its mission to offer informational, educational and recreational resources to library users of all ages. The library expects the use of its computers to conform to this



purpose.

So, if you ever find yourself in need of a computer, but don't have access to one, the library is here for you! We have eight public computers available for use, each equipped with MS Office and web browsers.

You must use your own MORE library card number and date of birth to log on to a computer. If you do not have a library card, you can use a Guest

Pass to use a computer - ask at the first-floor circulation desk if you need a Guest Pass. A Guest Pass cannot be used by patrons under the age of 16.

Library patrons will be allowed an initial session length of one hour. Library patrons may extend their session for more time if no other library patrons are waiting to use a computer.

Computers are available on a first-come first-served basis. The library does not take reservations for computer time in advance.

Free wireless Internet access (WiFi) is available throughout the library. The library's wireless network is not secure; no password is required to access the network.

Patrons using the library's computers or the library's WiFi network must conform to the library's **Computer Use and Internet Policy**.

How do I ... Explore the Library's Holdings Using the MORE Catalogue

In addition to searching the catalogue, there are several other ways to explore the MORE catalogue to find books to read, movies to watch, and audiobooks to listen to. As an aside, in case you have ever wondered, MORE stands for My Online REsource.

On the left of the MORE homepage -https://www.more.lib.wi.us/ - there is a column on the left labelled "Explore". There are five links in this column:

- 1. New Titles
- 2. Coming Soon
- 3. Awards
- 4. Bestsellers
- 5. Staff Picks

In many cases, the items displayed using one of these exploration methods can be sorted and filtered using the same methods as when you search for items. (For instructions on how to search the MORE catalogue and how to manipulate the search results, see the **November 1, 2024, newsletter**.)

The list of items displayed is for all of the 55 libraries in the MORE system, not just for the items owned by the Amery Area Public Library. In the content below the term "library" is used to mean all of the libraries in the MORE system and not just the Amery Area Public Library.

NEW TITLES

The New Titles page enables you to browse items the library has recently purchased. The page is divided into two areas: a New Titles Grid and a New Titles Searches area.

New Titles Grid

This area displays 24 of the latest items purchased by the library in the MORE system. You can filter the display by format or audience by selecting from the dropdown lists. Using the tab at the top, you can switch between the "On Order" and "Just Arrived" lists. Click the cover image to see more information about the title or to place a hold.

New Titles Searches

The area below the new titles grid displays is called the "Also See" section. It has three columns: Non-fiction; Fiction Film, Music & Literature; and Teens & Children. Each column has links to new items in a variety of categories. Clicking a link runs a search for items in that category.

COMING SOON

Clicking the "Coming Soon" link displays new titles that have been ordered but that have not arrived yet. Like the "New Titles Grid", this grid can be filtered by format or audience by selecting from the dropdown lists. Click the cover image to see more information about the title or place a hold.

Like the New Titles Grid, there is an "Also See" section under the "Coming Soon Grid". It has the same three columns: Non-fiction; Fiction Film, Music & Literature; and Teens & Children. Each column has links to new items in a variety of categories. Clicking a link runs a search for items in that category.

AWARDS

Clicking the "Awards" link displays a grid of award-winning items that are available now. Under the grid, there are controls for filtering the list of award-winning items. You can use these to see award winners in books, movies & TV, and music.

You can also filter the list of award winners by specific awards in the United States, Australia, and the United Kingdom. Clicking one of the awards displays a list of items that have won that award sorted by newest to oldest. You can filter the list by category and by nomination year. The lists are sorted from newest to oldest.

BESTSELLERS

Clicking the "Bestsellers" link displays a grid of bestselling books. Under the grid, there are links to bestseller lists in the United States and Canada. Like the Awards lists, the bestseller lists can be filtered by category. The lists are sorted from newest to oldest.

STAFF PICKS

Clicking "Staff Picks" displays lists created by staff at the library. There are three sets of lists.

Lists from Library Staff

These are lists of books, DVDs, and audiobooks on a given topic. As the name of this column implies, the lists have been created by library staff.

New at the Library

This column contains links to lists of new items by format and audience. When you click one of the links, the MORE catalogue is searched for new items within the format or audience you selected.


Popular Formats

This column contains links to lists of items by format. When you click a link, the MORE catalogue is searched for all the items that are a specific format. For example, clicking "All DVDs" displays a list of all the DVDs held at the library (In case you are wondering, when this newsletter was written, there were 38,878 DVDs in the system).



GETTYSBURG ADDRESS


