Going on vacation in December or next year and need help selecting a book? Need a book recommendation for a holiday gift? Read everything by

your favorite author and want to find an author like them? Liked a book and want to find others like it? In charge of a book club and need to pick out the next book? Putting together a list of books on a subject? Then you should use NoveList Plus, a database containing thousands of book reviews.

Using it, you can find book, author, and series recommendations, author biographies, articles and lists for fiction and nonfiction books. You can search by keyword or by genre. It even allows you to find books with diverse characters.

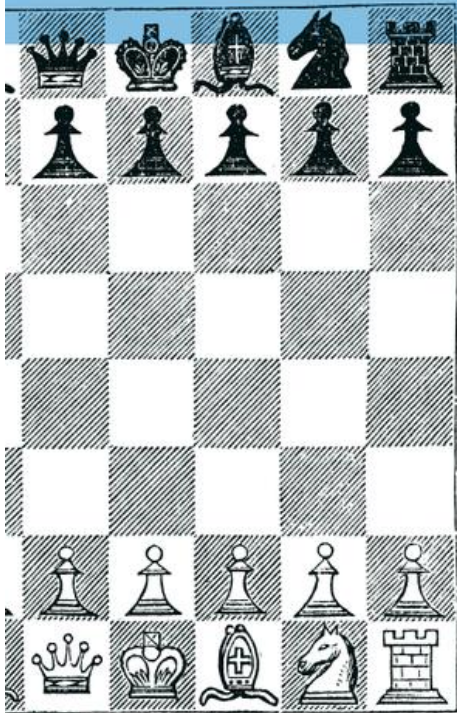

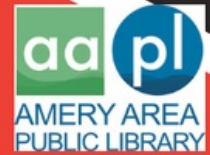

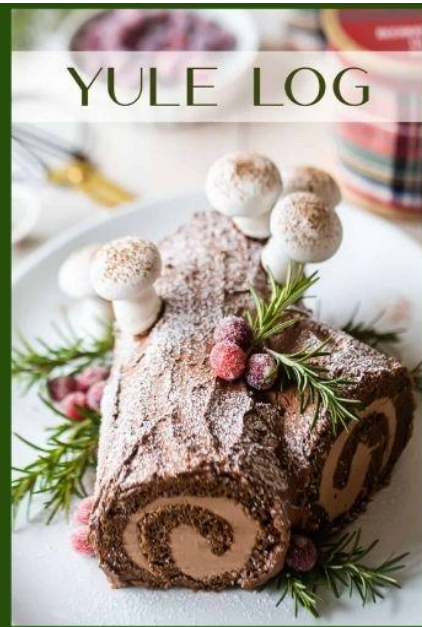


Special Programs

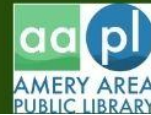
The demonstration will include preparation of the cake, the fillings and the meringue mushrooms. It can be a new family tradition and is a not to be missed class for chocolate lovers.

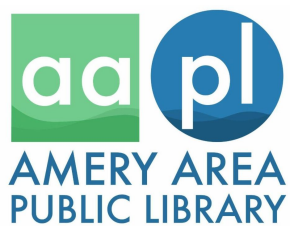
